Mission Statement

State Recognized Tribal Artists and tribal leaders recognize that the guild preserves and promotes the unique Indigenous arts and artists from across our lands. The Guild provides a centralized place to share creative ideas, professional development for our artists and a method for the public to engage with our artists.

Membership to the State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild is offered to artists or crafts persons who are currently enrolled in an Official State Recognized Indian Tribe in the United States. You must be 18 years old to apply. You must complete this application in full and email a copy of it, along with a copy of your tribal ID to our email address located at the top of this application.

By submitting this application, you agree that officers of the **State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild** may contact the tribe you are enrolled in for verification; that you support the mission of the **State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild**; that you agree to the bylaws of the Guild; that you agree to and abide by the Indian Arts and Crafts Act of 1990; and you agree to abide by the **State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild Code of Ethics**.

Information provided by the applicant herein shall be treated as confidential and shall be used solely for the purpose of establishing and maintaining membership in the **State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild**. No information provided to apply will be shared with anyone or any organization outside the parameters of the **State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild** without the applicants approval.

Things the **State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild** will provide:

- Resources for Native American artists
- Communication about current activities, opportunities and upcoming events
- Information sharing via blogs, social media
- Networking space for artists to connect to each other and beyond
- Web space for each artist.

Indian Arts & Craft Act of 1990

The Indian Arts and Crafts Act (IACA) of 1990 (P.L. 101-644) is a truth-in-advertising law that prohibits misrepresentation in the marketing of Indian art and craft products within the United States. It is illegal to offer or display for sale, or sell, any art or craft product in a manner that falsely suggests it is Indian produced, an Indian product, or the product of a particular Indian or Indian tribe or Indian arts and crafts organization, resident within the United States. For a first time violation of the IACA, an individual can face civil or criminal penalties up to a \$250,000 fine or a 5-year prison term, or both. If a business violates the IACA, it can face civil penalties or can be prosecuted and fined up to \$1,000,000.

Under the IACA, an Indian is defined as a member of any federally or officially state recognized tribe of the United States, or an individual certified as an Indian artisan by an Indian tribe.

State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild Code of Ethics

All members of the State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild meet the guidelines of <u>The Indian Arts and Crafts Act</u> and agree to adhere to the following:

- I agree to represent true Indian arts and crafts as to the nature and origin within the realm of my control. I agree to
 offer return privileges for articles found by the State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild to have been misrepresented
 by me.
- I agree to abide by all federal, state, local, and tribal laws pertaining to Indian arts & crafts, artifacts, and natural resources.
- I agree to maintain ethical business conduct regarding advertising, appraising, pricing and any guarantees offered by me.
- I agree to respect and support the ethical business activities of the State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild members.
- I agree to encourage consumer confidence in the authenticity of all articles I have identified with the State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild seal/logo or certification seal.
- I agree to work with law enforcement agencies and the State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild in any investigations of crimes involving the Indian Arts and Crafts Act and I will promote proper identification of Indian Arts and Crafts.
- As a State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild member, I agree to no lateral oppression or violence against any State Recognized Tribal Artists Guild member.
